Two Faces of South Viet Nam's Madame Ky

Mai Ky, 24-year-old wife of South Viet Nam's Premier Nguyen Cao Ky, presents two sharply contrasting pictures as she poses in her belligerent outfit complete with gun-belt and pistol, and then as the young wife and mother

holding their daughter Duyen, 7 months, outside their Saigon home. Madame Ky can cook, draw a gun in Wyatt Earp style, copilot a DC3 and speak three languages, including French and English.






